DIRECTOR

Mr. Hedding has also taught bands in Grand Rapids, Minnesota and Garner, Iowa. Mr. Hedding was a middle school band director for the Cedar Rapids Community School District in Cedar Rapids, Iowa for 8 years before coming to Belvidere, IL in 2002. Mr. Hedding has performed on trumpet, clarinet, and percussion with the Marion Community band from Marion, Iowa. Mr. Hedding also has extensive experience in the Drum and Bugle Corps activity with such groups as the Madison Scouts from Madison, Wisconsin and the Nite Express from Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Mr. Hedding has also performed with the Eastern Iowa Brass Band and the Rockford Wind Ensemble.

During performances you are expected to be good, attentive listeners for the other groups. **Students are expected to stay for the entire concert to earn full credit for that performance.**

BAND GOALS

STAFF GOALS:

- 1) The students should be better musicians after having been a member of the Band.
- 2) The students should be better individuals after they leave the Band.
- 3) The students should have fun and enjoy their learning experiences while they are in the Band.

STUDENT GOALS:

Students who are learning about music must be able to comprehend all the concepts, skills and activities that are exposed to them in the band program. To achieve excellence in musical competency the following goals have been established for the band students. These goals are based on the **National Standards for Music Education recommended by the Federal Government in 1993.**

Students should:

- 1) Make music alone and with others.
- 2) Understand the basic concepts of music.
- 3) Respond to music intellectually, emotionally and physically.
- 4) Make aesthetic judgments based on critical listening and analysis.
- 5) Develop positive attitudes toward music.
- 6) Experiment with musical creativity alone and with others.
- 7) Use the vocabulary and notation of music.
- 8) Become acquainted with a wide variety of musical styles.
- 9) Become familiar with the role music plays in the lives of men and women.
- 10) Develop a feeling of worth for self and others.
- 11) Develop computer literacy skills with music software programs.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS FOR BAND

PERFORMANCE EXPECTATIONS:

- 1) Attendance at **all** performances is required.
- 2) The band director must approve all absences **one week prior** to the performance. An advanced absence form **must** be filled out.
- 3) Absences will be dealt with on an individual basis.
- 4) Attire for performances will be as follows: 6th Grade - white shirt, black pants or skirt, 7th and 8th Grade - band uniform, black socks, black shoes

CLASSROOM AND REHEARSAL EXPECTATIONS:

- 1) Students should be in their assigned spot
- 2) Students should come prepared with all their music, mutes, reeds, valve oil, and a **pencil**.
- 3) Talking during rehearsal will not be tolerated.
- 4) Respect for everyone in the room must be present at all times.
- 5) No food or drink or gum is allowed in the room **at any time**.

LESSON EXPECTATIONS:

- 1) All students will work out of a technique book. Percussionist will be expected to prepare material on bells and snare.
- 2) Students are responsible for attending their scheduled lessons and to show musical growth each grading period. A practice record must be filled out before each lesson (Minimum of **140 min per week**).
- 3) Students are responsible for setting up make-up lessons for any missed lessons. Lessons **may** be excused on an individual basis.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1) Students are to communicate with the band director about anything relating to the band program and its expectations. Remember the director can not read your mind.
- 2) This is a performance-based course and excessive absences at rehearsals and performances will not be tolerated.
- 3) You represent South Middle School and our program. Always conduct yourself in a way that is positive.

BSMS BAND GRADING POLICY

Your band grade will be based on the following criteria:

50% Attendance and Attitude

Attendance at all rehearsal and performances is required. The director understands that there may be times when it is necessary to be absent. Attitude, in reference to personal and musical growth, will be considered as it reflects on the individual, their section and the ensemble.

50% Technique Lessons

Based on attendance at lessons and the amount of musical growth during the grading period. Each lesson will receive a letter grade of A, B, C, D, or F. Your final lesson grade will be the average of those grades. The expectation is that you will pass all material assigned for each lesson. You are expected to make up all missed lessons. Make-up lesson must be scheduled in advance.

Extra credit options include the following: participating in the solo and ensemble festival, IMEA Band or Jazz Festival, concert set up and tear down, extra lessons beyond the required amount, and other areas to be approved by the director.

BAND ROOM REGULATIONS

- 1) The band room is a place to practice.
- 2) All equipment, including instruments and music must be stored in their proper place.
- 3) Only percussionists are allowed in the percussion area.
- 4) Do not play each other's instruments. This is unsanitary and dangerously expensive should damage occur.
- 5) Keep the band room clean. This means no pop, food or drink will be allowed in the room.
- 6) All personal items should be left in your locker.
- 7) Knock before entering the band office.
